More and more sulfur-free fuels are now on the market (sulfur content of max. 10 ppm). This kind of fuel is not just approved by DC, but the use thereof is expressly welcomed by DC as a way of protecting the environment.

A prerequisite is compliance with DIN EN 590 for diesel fuel and DIN EN 228 for gasoline. Customers can find this information on the usual DIN badge on the gasoline pump. These fuels can also be used for older vehicles, providing that they are of the required quality.
